

Teach kids the following motions that will go along with today's Bible passage: Angel—make a halo over your head with your hands; Mary—rub your belly; Baby—cradle a pretend baby.

Open your Bible to Luke 1, and show children the words. SAY: As I read what the Bible says about today's Mighty Mini, listen for the words angel, Mary, and baby. When you hear those words, do the motions!

One day a woman named Mary (pause) was at her home. All of a sudden, Mary (pause) was surprised—there was an angel (pause) standing in front of her!

Mary (pause) felt a little scared, but the angel (pause) said, "Don't be scared, Mary (pause)! Because God thinks you're so special, you're going to have a special baby (pause). This baby (pause) will be named Jesus, and he'll be God's Son."

Mary (pause) was confused. She didn't know how she was going

to have a baby (pause)! The angel (pause) told her that God would give her this special baby (pause), God's Son, because nothing is impossible with God. Mary (pause) was happy that she was going to have a baby (pause). She said to the angel (pause), "I will do whatever God wants." Then the angel (pause) left Mary's (pause) house.

Mary (pause) was happy about what the angel (pause) had said. She sang a song to thank God for giving her a baby (pause), who would be God's Son. Just like Mary (pause), WE CELEBRATE JESUS* BIRTH.

ASK: **Tell about good news and how you celebrated it.**

What part of Mary's (pause) experience makes you want to celebrate?

What do you do to celebrate Christmas?

SAY: The angel's (pause) news to Mary (pause) didn't seem like good news at first. She didn't know what to think! But it turned out to be some of the best news ever. God was sending Jesus to earth to be our Savior! That's why WE CELEBRATE JESUS' BIRTH. It's great news!





SAY: WE CELEBRATE JESUS'
BIRTH. Just as Mary sang a song to
celebrate Jesus' birth, we can, too!
Let's stand up and sing this song
about baby Jesus.

Play • "Mary's Boy Child" (track 7) on the CD. Lead the children in singing this song and pretending to rock a baby to the beat. Listen for the words Mary and angels for children to do the corresponding motions. (Angels—make a halo over your head with your hands; Mary—rub your belly.)

Lead children in singing the song two or three times so kids become familiar with the words.

SING:

Long time ago in Bethlehem, So the Holy Bible say, Mary's boy child, Jesus Christ, Was born on Christmas day.

(Chorus)

Hark now, hear the angels sing: A new King born today, That folks may live forevermore Because of Christmas day.

Now Joseph and his wife, Mary,

Went to Bethlehem that night And found no place to lay their head—

Not a single room was in sight.

(Sing chorus.)

While shepherds watched their flocks by night,
They saw a bright, new, shining

star.

And from the East there came three men Bearing gifts from afar.

(Sing chorus.)

"Mary's Boy Child" by Jester Hairston.

ASK: Tell about the people in our song. What reasons did they have to celebrate?

What would you like to say to Jesus to celebrate his birth?

SAY: Just as the angel told Mary, she ended up having a baby—
God's Son, Jesus. Jesus' birth might not have seemed like a big deal, because he was just born in a barn. But Mary, Joseph, the shepherds, and the wise men knew that Jesus' birth was cause for celebration. Let's give a big cheer for Jesus to show that > WE CELEBRATE JESUS' BIRTH. Lead kids in cheering.

Body Play It!

POINT WE CELEBRATE JESUS' BIRTH.

SAY: WE CELEBRATE JESUS*
BIRTH. We're going to celebrate
by playing a game. First, let's hold
hands to make a circle. When kids
have formed a circle, have them
let go of each other's hands and sit
down.

SAY: The angel came to Mary to tell her she'd be the mother of baby Jesus. We're going to tell each other about baby Jesus, too. This game is played like Duck, Duck, Goose, but without the running. Select one child to be the first Angel. The Angel will walk around the outside of the circle tapping the heads of the other children saying "Mary, Mary, Mary," When the Angel says "baby Jesus" while tapping a child's head, the children will trade places. The seated child will stand up and become the new Angel, and the first Angel will sit in the vacated space. Play several rounds.

ASK: What good news have you heard about Jesus?

What do you think an angel looks like?

Would you want to see an angel? Explain.

SAY: You might not have had an angel tell you about Jesus like Mary did, but I bet you've had a lot of wonderful people pass on the great news of Jesus! Remember that Jesus loves you and that WE CELEBRATE JESUS' BIRTH.



SAY: When the angel visited Mary, Mary praised God and said, "The Mighty One has done great things for me!" She spent time thinking about how great God is.

It's good to praise God for his wonderful gift of Jesus. That's one way WE CELEBRATE JESUS' BIRTH. Think about this question on your own. In a minute, we can share answers.

ASK: What great things has God done for you?

Give children time to ponder their own ideas. After a minute, encourage them to praise God for those things by sharing them with the group. SAY: God has done great things for all of us! And when Mary said God had done great things, she was celebrating something God did for all of us. God sent his Son to live on earth and be our Savior! That was good news for Mary, and it's good news for us. God has done great things, and WE CELEBRATE JESUS' BIRTH.



Give each child a piece of paper and a crayon. Ask children to draw an angel as big as the piece of paper. SAY: The angel told Mary that she was special and loved by God. Hold your angel, find a partner, and use the angel to tell each other, "You're special!" Allow time for kids to form several different pairs and interact using the angels.

ASK: What does the word special mean to you?

What makes you special?

How can you make someone else feel special?

SAY: Today we're learning that

WE CELEBRATE JESUS' BIRTH.

Jesus was born because he thinks
we're all special. So he came to
earth to do something special for
us. Mary was the special woman
who got to be Jesus' mom. But
we're all special, too, because we
all get to be Jesus' friend.
